The Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma who cares for the Tamil language and the people of Tamil Nadu strives hard untiringly for the welfare of the people. The Information and Public Relations Department acts as the eyes and ears of the Government disseminating the information on the activities and welfare schemes of the government among the public, acting as a bridge of goodwill between the government and the public.

The Department of Information and Public Relations popularizes the welfare schemes and the benefits by various means. The Department endeavours

- To take the schemes announced by the Hon'ble Chief Minister and the Hon'ble Ministers to the people through various print and electronic media
- To create awareness on the schemes by organizing exhibitions and photo exhibitions
- To publicize the development schemes through artistic and informative advertisements

- To publish the schemes, developmental activities and achievements of the government in Tamilarasu and special publications
- To honour freedom fighters, Tamil savants and eminent leaders by organizing functions
- To honour the great leaders by constructing memorials so that the younger generation emulate their great qualities.
- To produce news reel bulletins on the government schemes and to screen them in rural areas and theatres
- To create future cine professionals by offering courses in technical aspects of film and television production.

Thus the Information and Public Relations department using the latest communication technology creates a feeling of nearness and direct communication between the remote villages of Tamil Nadu and the Secretariat.

PRESS RELEASE SECTION

Press Release Section is an important section of the department of Information and Public Relations which functions 24 hours a day on all 365 days. The Press Release Section releases the announcements, achievements, press releases and press notes of the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers, information on Government welfare schemes, development works, Government sponsored programmes and related photographs to the print and electronic media. They are sent by e-mail and fax to media numbering around 200 in order to reach out to the public instantaneously.

This Section also organizes the press conferences of the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers. Important press releases containing Government announcements are sent to District Information and Public Relations Offices so that the media in the districts also publish them. This Section makes all the necessary arrangements for the media to gather news about the functions attended by Hon'ble Ministers and Secretaries and Collectors.

Besides, news and photographs of the Government functions and other programmes in the districts attended by Hon'ble Ministers are received by this section through the Information and Public Relations Offices concerned and are sent to the media at the headquarters, by this section.

JOURNALISTS' WELFARE

JOURNALISTS' PENSION

This scheme is being implemented since 1986. A monthly pension of Rs.5000/- was given to retired journalists in indigent circumstances who had served for 20 years and above. Hon'ble Chief Minister has enhanced this pension amount to Rs.6,000/- from 14.09.2011. A sum of Rs.45.00 lakhs was allocated for the pension during 2011-2012. Pension has been sanctioned to 109 journalists so far under this scheme.

JOURNALISTS' FAMILY PENSION

A monthly family pension of Rs.2500/- was given to the wife of a Journalist pensioner, on his death. Hon'ble Chief Minister has enhanced this amount to Rs.3000/- from 14.09.2011. So far wives of 25 deceased pensioners have been benefited under this scheme. A sum of Rs.5.40 lakh was allotted during 2011-2012 for this scheme.

JOURNALISTS' FAMILY BENEFIT FUND

Journalists' Family Benefit Fund is being given from the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund to families of journalists who happen to die while serving as editor/sub-editor/reporter/photographer/proof-reader. The amount being paid are as follows:

Eligibility Criteria

So far, families of 46 deceased journalists have been benefited.

JOURNALISTS' MEDICAL WELFARE FUND

Rs.1 crore has been allocated for this fund has been deposited with Tamil Nadu Power Finance and Infrastructure Development Corporation fetching an interest of Rs.83,333/- per month. A Journalist in service who suffers from serious illness is eligible for a sum of Rs.50,000/- for medical treatment.

GOVERNMENT RENTAL HOUSING SCHEME FOR JOURNALISTS

Tamil Nadu Housing Board is allotting rental quarters to journalists under special category. So far, 367 journalists have been allotted.

HOUSE SITES FOR JOURNALISTS

Under this scheme, 785 journalists have so far been provided with house sites at concessional rates.

ACCREDITATION CARDS FOR MEDIA

Press Accreditation Cards are provided every year to media personnel working in newspapers / television channels/news agencies on the recommendation of the Press Accreditation Committee constituted by the Government. These cards are issued to the journalists through the District Collectors in the districts.

PRESS PASS CARDS TO JOURNALISTS

Press Pass Cards are issued to journalists of periodicals on the recommendation of the Press Pass Recommendation Committee, constituted by the government.

FREE BUS PASSES TO JOURNALISTS

To enable journalists to collect news, free bus passes are issued valid for a year to travel in Government Transport Corporation buses are issued every year. This Department reimburses an approximate sum of Rs.55.00 lakh per year to the Transport Corporations to meet this expenditure.

To facilitate delivery of video clippings of Hon'ble Chief Minister's functions and Government programmes instantaneously to media from the Press Release Section in the Secretariat, an **online media exchange and supply chain management solution** established at a cost of Rs.50.00 lakh will be shortly inaugurated.

Media Centre

As ordered by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, a Media Centre established at an estimate of Rs.31.00 lakhs in the Secretariat will be shortly inaugurated to facilitate the media personnel to send their news and photographs to their concerns immediately.

PHOTO SECTION

Colour photographs are taken with digital cameras and sent from the Secretariat by e-mail to about 200 media organizations simultaneously. Further, photographs of important functions are sent immediately to the media from the function site itself by using laptops with internet facility.

All function photographs are preserved for future use in CDs format. Already 75,000 rare negatives of photographs have been digitally scanned with suitable titles and preserved for easy retrieval at a cost of Rs. 13.25 lakhs. Further, 1.60 lakh negatives of photographs will be shortly digitally scanned and preserved.

Renovated Photo Gallery

Hon'ble Chief Minister inaugurated the photo gallery renovated at an estimate of Rs.14 lakhs on 06.01.2012 at the Secretariat main building. An average of 2,500 people watch these photographs daily.



High End Digital Cameras

Hon'ble Chief Minister provided 30 High End Digital Cameras to the district PROs at an estimate cost of Rs.89,85,000/- and 9 Canon Digital Still Cameras for Head Quarters at an estimate of Rs.22,50,000/- to improve the photographs.

The Reference Section brings to the notice of the Government the important news items published in newspapers and periodicals. This section consolidates the news clippings from dailies, periodicals and upcountry newspapers and submits them daily for the perusal of the Hon'ble Chief Minister. News clippings are also submitted to the Hon'ble Ministers, Chief Secretary and Secretaries to Government for perusal and necessary action. Important Tamil and English newspapers are preserved for future reference. They would be available to the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Ministers and Secretaries to Government for reference whenever needed.

As ordered by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, digitalization of the old news papers, paper clippings under various headings viz, announcements speeches, interviews of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, welfare schemes, achievements, Government Orders, editorials, stories/essays, reviews/criticisms, statements of various leaders etc is being done at an estimate of Rs.75.00 lakhs.

NEWS COVERAGES

Tamil Nadu Films Division covers all Government functions participated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers throughout Tamil Nadu and releases them in the form of video news magazines throughout the State.

VIDEO NEWS MAGAZINE PRODUCTION

Tamil Nadu Films Division produces Video News Magazines in C.D format containing the programmes of important welfare schemes, announcements and development activities of the Government. These Video News Magazines are sent to all the District Information and Public Relations Offices for field publicity through video vans in places where people gather in large numbers.

So far Tamil Nadu Films Division has produced 123 Video News Magazines. During last one year, 9 Nos. of Video News Magazines were produced.

FILM NEWS REEL

Video News Magazines are compiled with 10 minutes duration and transferred into 35 mm film. After obtaining the Censor Certificate from the Central Board of Film Certification, 147 prints are taken in 35 mm film. It is released through the Films Division, Government of India, Chennai and Madurai Branches to all the theatres in Tamil Nadu.

So far Tamil Nadu Films Division has produced 459 News Reels/Documentaries. During last one year, seven Film News Reels were produced.

Qube

With the technological advancement present day films are screened in theatres through satellites and Qube Digital Technology as times have changed from the use of projector with carbon sticks. More than 60% of the theatres in Tamilnadu have been upgraded to the Qube Technology. Since Video magazines of Tamilnadu Films Division were produced in 35 mm films so far, it was impossible to screen them in theatres having Qube Digital Technology. Starting from the "Thane Relief measures" video magazine Hard Discs are being supplied to enable screening Films Division films in all theatres containing Qube Technology. Through this, the 100% screening of Tamil Nadu Films Division Newsreels in all theatres in Tamilnadu has been ensured, paving the way for the message of Hon'ble Chief Minister's functions, Welfare assistance and Government schemes to reach the people.

MGR GOVERNMENT FILM AND TELEVISION TRAINING INSTITUTE

MGR Government Film and Television Training Institute is an advanced Technical Training Institute imparting Film Techniques and aesthetics of Film and Television Production and Allied Subjects and Film Appreciation.

It is one of the three major institutes in India. The other two are Film and TV Institute of India, Pune, and Sathyajit Ray Film and Television Institute, Kolkata.

This Institute is run by the Government of Tamil Nadu and is functioning under the administrative control of the Director of Information and Public Relations.

DIPLOMA COURSES

Three year diploma courses are offered in the following subjects:

- 1 Screenplay & Direction
- 2 Cinematography
- 3 Sound Recording and Sound Engineering
- 4 Film Editing
- 5 Film Processing

All the Diploma Courses offered are approved by the All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi.

Any degree will be a prerequisite qualification for admission in Screenplay and Direction Course and for the other courses, a pass in

Higher Secondary is the qualification. Fourteen students are admitted in each discipline.

Notification for admission to courses is published in leading Tamil and English newspapers and admissions commence in July of every academic year. Tuition fees of Rs.10,000/-, Special fees of Rs.1,500/- and Development fees of Rs.1,000/- are collected from the students.

Financial Support For Students

Final year students from different branches form 14 units and each unit is trained to produce short films. The Government sanctions a sum of Rs.14.00 lakhs for the production of students Diploma Film every year. The Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma has raised the reimbursement of cost for the production of Students Diploma Films from Rs.8000/- to Rs.15000/- per film from the financial year 2011-2012.

Short Film Award

The Government of Tamil Nadu appreciates and encourages the students by presenting an award titled "MGR Government Film and Television Training Institute Award" which consists of One Sovereign Gold Medal, Cash Award of Rs.5,000/- and a memento to the Best Director, Best Cinematographer, Best Editor, Best Sound Recordist and Best Film Processor of the Short Films produced.

Financial Support for Film Festival

The Government also sanctions a sum of Rs.75,000/- per annum to enable students to send their short films to National and International film festivals.

AC Shooting Floor

Hon'ble Chief Minister opened on 6.1.2012 the Air-conditioned Shooting floor renovated at a cost of Rs.1.43 crores at MGR Government Film and Television Training Institute, Film Producers and Small Screen

producers can avail this facility besides the students of the Institute, who can observe the shooting process, get to know the latest equipments and technology and also interact with the shooting crew. This Air-conditioned shooting floor measuring 120' length and 60' wide has been installed with facilities for best sound/light recordings. This shooting floor is the largest in Tamilnadu equipped with 2 small shooting halls, 3 make-up rooms, equipped costume hall and parking. Film Producers and small screen producers can make use of this shooting floor at the fee prescribed by the Government.

CINEMA, VIDEO AND CABLE TELEVISION NETWORKS

Among other industries, Film Industry is one of the industries in Tamil Nadu which contributes considerable revenue to the Tamil Nadu Government. Films in different languages like Tamil, Malayalam, Telugu, Kannada and Hindi are produced in Tamil Nadu. The Cinema Industry contributes income to the local bodies also. Further, Cinema industry provides employment opportunities to several thousands of Cinema artists and technicians. To regulate the cinema industry, the Government of Tamil Nadu had enacted the Tamil Nadu Cinemas (Regulation) Act 1955.

This Act provides for grant of licences to private individuals for exhibition of films in cinema houses. As per the provisions of the Act, the Collector is the Licensing Authority in the districts and in respect of Chennai, the Commissioner of Police is the Licensing Authority. The Joint Commissioner of Land Administration is the Appellate Authority and the Government is the Revisional Authority against the decision of the Appellate Authority. Apart from the above act, the Tamil Nadu Cinema (Regulation) Rules' 1957 were framed to provide proper maintenance of cinema theatres, including structural soundness of buildings with basic amenities etc.

There are 1056 Cinema Theatres functioning in Tamil Nadu. The categories are given below: -

CABLE TELEVISION NETWORK SYSTEM:-

The Cable Television Network (Regulation) Act' 1995 (Central Act), regulates the Cable Television Network all over India. As per the amended Cable Television Network (Regulation) Act of 2000 (Act of XXXVI of 2000), District Magistrates, Sub-Divisional Magistrates and all Police Commissioners have been designated as Authorised Officers to take action against offending Cable Television Operators for contravening section 3, 5, 6 and 8 of the Act. Accordingly the Government of Tamil Nadu have issued notification. The Commissioner of Police in respect of Chennai, Trichy, Tirunelveli, Madurai, Salem and Coimbatore cities, the Collectors of the District concerned in respect of other areas and Sub-Divisional Officers in their respective local limits of police jurisdiction have been authorized to take action against offending the Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act' 1995. Further, the Government of Tamil Nadu has issued the instructions to all the District Collectors / Commissioner of Police / Superintendent of Police for strict enforcement against the wrong doers who violates the above said act. The Government of India by its notification dated 09.01.2004 have entrusted the Cable services under the purview of Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI).

VIDEO ACT AND RULES

The Tamil Nadu Exhibition of Films on Television Screen through the Video Cassette Recorders and Cable Television Network (Regulation) Act'

1984, regulates the exhibition of films on television screen through Video Cassette Recorder (VCR) in the State of Tamil Nadu. This Act provides for the grant of license to the individuals for exhibition of films on television screen through Video Cassette Recorder (VCR) and for running Video Libraries. The respective District Collectors / Commissioner of Police, Chennai acts as the Licensing Authorities.

VIDEO PIRACY CELL

The Video Piracy Cell, Crime Branch, C.I.D., Tamil Nadu is functioning under the direct control of the Additional Director-General of Police (Crime), Chennai. The service of this cell is also being utilized to check the violations relating to the Copy Right Act / Information Technology Act 2000. There are twelve units of Video Piracy Cell functioning now. The details of cases registered, number of accused and the value of properties seized etc., by the Video Piracy Cell from the year 2004 to 2011 are as follows: -

EXHIBITION SECTION

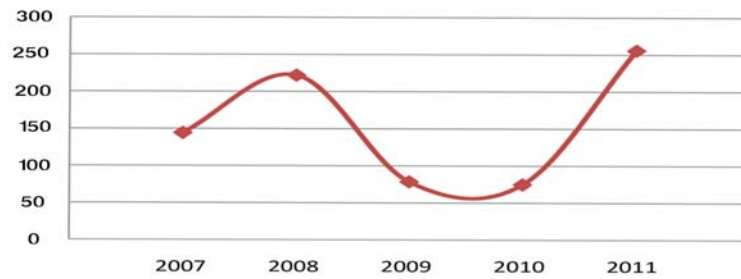
Government Exhibitions

Government exhibitions are organized to enable people to easily understand the schemes, achievements and activities of the Government as exhibitions draw people in large numbers. Visual displays are grasped easily by mind and hence reach a larger audience. These exhibitions are organized in district headquarters during festive seasons and holidays so that a large number of people will be able to see the exhibition and benefit.

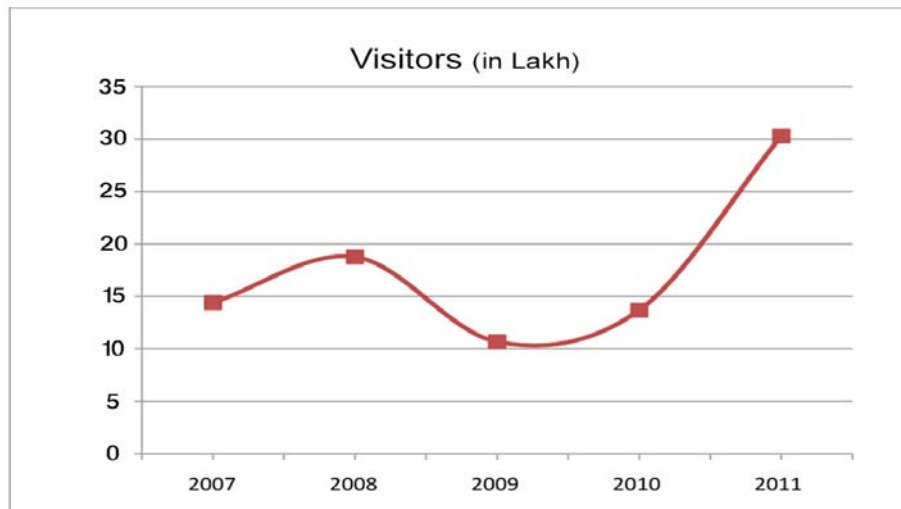
Central and State Government Departments, public sector undertakings and private concerns take part in these exhibitions. The Government Exhibitions apart from creating awareness among the people regarding Government schemes and achievements and entertaining the general public, provide employment opportunities. Various cultural programmes are being organized in the exhibitions which benefit artistes who live in impoverished conditions. Best pavilions of the Government departments are awarded prizes. So far, 135 Government Exhibitions have been organized by the Information and Public Relations Department and a sum of Rs.2608.69 lakh has been earned as profit for the Government.

Government exhibitions are organised every year in Coimbatore, Madurai, Salem, and were organized once in two years in Vellore and Tirunelveli. As ordered by the Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma, necessary actions are being taken to organize exhibitions every year in Vellore, Tirunelveli, Thanjavur, Tiruchirapalli, Thiruvannamalai and Thoothukkudi.

Accordingly, a Government exhibition was held in Tiruchirapalli for 45 days from 12.1.2012 to 28.2.2012. Rs.46.50 lakhs has been earned as revenue from this exhibition.

Presently Government exhibitions organized in Madurai is 137th exhibitions.

PRIVATE EXHIBITIONS

The department of Information and Public Relations frames rules and regulations for the conduct of private exhibitions for the benefit and recreation of the public and grants permission for holding private exhibitions on the recommendations of the District Collectors concerned.

ANNUAL FLOWER FESTIVAL AT NEW DELHI

Every year this Department represents Government of Tamil Nadu in the Annual Flower Festival (Phool Walon-Ki-Saire) organized for the promotion of National Integration and Religious Harmony at New Delhi. Tamil Nadu bagged the first price in the flower festival held during November, 2011.

REPUBLIC DAY PAGEANTRY PROCESSION

The Information and Public Relations Department participates in the pageantry procession at the Republic Day Celebrations in Chennai and New Delhi every year. This department co-ordinates the procession of the pageantry of floats in the Republic Day Celebrations in Chennai. The float of Information and Public Relations Department displaying photographs of Hon'ble Chief Minister with the eminent leaders received the first prize for the best display of Government schemes in the Republic Day celebrations held in 2012.

INDIA TOURIST – INDUSTRIAL TRADE FAIR

This Department participates in the All India Tourist and Industrial Trade Fair (Island Grounds) in Chennai every year where the policies, activities and achievements of the Government with photographs and models are displayed.

INDIA INTERNATIONAL TRADE FAIR

This department also participates every year in India International Trade Fair, New Delhi displaying the aims, activities and achievements of

the State Government. The Government earns revenue through these exhibitions besides providing employment opportunities to thousands of people.

MULTIMEDIA PUBLICITY CAMPAIGNS

Multimedia Publicity Campaigns and mini-photo exhibitions are conducted in all districts by coordinating various departments of the Government vividly explaining the schemes, policies and achievements of the Government to the people. Publicity is also done through various cultural programmes during multimedia campaigns.

As ordered by Hon'ble Chief Minister to organize multimedia campaign, in district, no Government exhibition is held, multimedia campaigns have been successfully completed with an allocation of Rs.2.50 lakhs for each district. 7,94,352 persons have visited campaign and benefited.

Moreover, mini-multimedia exhibitions are conducted during the Mass Contact Programmes of the District Collectors in villages.

MINI EXHIBITIONS AT BLOCK LEVEL

As ordered by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Block level mini exhibitions are being organized in each district in order to disseminate information on the Government's welfare schemes and achievements among the people. A sum of Rs.38.50 lakhs was allocated at the rate of Rs.10,000/- per Panchayat Union. During 2011-2012 mini exhibitions have been conducted in 97 Panchayat Unions in 31 districts. 4,02,100 people visited and were benefited.

DISTRICT INFORMATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICES

The Information and Public Relations Offices in all the 32 districts form a vital part of the Information and Public Relations Department. The District Information and Public Relations Officers disseminate information relating to the welfare schemes and activities of the Government besides creating awareness among the people through print and electronic media.

The District Information and Public Relation Officers release Government press releases and photographs to media, organize video shows in places where people throng in large numbers, press conferences and publicity through local cable TV Channels, Government functions, multi-media campaigns and mini-exhibitions besides maintaining memorials.

With a view to facilitate the work of the Information and Public Relations Officers in the districts, the district offices have been upgraded with necessary infrastructure.

New vehicles

The Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma handed over 34 vehicles viz, 16 Bolero jeeps, 17 Tempo Traveller Video vans and 1 Toyota Innova purchased at an estimate of Rs.2,29,74,000/- for the office of the I & PRO in districts and headquarters, at Secretariat on 3.3.2012.



INFORMATION CENTRES

Information Centres are functioning in Chennai, Madurai, Tiruchirapalli, Thanjavur, Coimbatore and New Delhi. Books, newspapers and periodicals are made available in these Information Centres for the use of school and college students, teachers and research scholars.

STATE INFORMATION CENTRE, CHENNAI

The State Information Centre, which was located in Omanthurar Govt. Estate, Chennai has been shifted to the first floor of Bharathiyar Illam, Triplicane. A library and a reading room are functioning in this Centre.

Books on various subjects such as history, biographies of leaders, children's books, science, politics, etc are available. Proceedings of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, publications of the Assembly and Government publications are available here for reference. In the reading room of the State Information Centre, Tamil and English daily newspapers and periodicals are kept for the public to read. Many readers make use of this facility every day.

Periodicals and newspapers are preserved for future reference by the Government. Reference materials are provided to Hon'ble Ministers and officials as and when required. Necessary reference books are also made available to Tamil Arasu for information.

REGISTRATION OF BOOKS

The Director of Information and Public Relations is the Registrar of Books as per the Newspapers and Books Registration Act, 1867. Two copies of all the books published every year are received from publishers and registered in this office.
